Troops 28 and 1028, Hebron CT - Code of Conduct On My Honor

Scouts BSA strive to create in young women and men the values and character needed to become honorable and strong leaders.

As a Scout representing Troop 1028 or Troop 28, my behavior will exemplify the Scout Oath and my guide will be the principles stated in the Scout Law.

Behavior unbecoming a scout [public profanity, disrespect of others, punching, hazing, etc.] is subject to disciplinary action by the Troop adult leadership present. This Code of Conduct governs all Troop activities (weekly Troop meetings, campouts, hikes, special trips, etc.).

Any Scout causing a disruption or discipline issue at a meeting or event will be instructed to stop. If the scout persists, he will be sent home. If an issue arises during a campout or other overnight trip, then the Scout's parents will be called to pick up their son. Any Scout so disciplined will not be allowed to participate in any further Troop activities until his parents speak with both the Scoutmaster and the Troop Committee Chairman. Persons authorized to send a Scout home are the registered adult Scout Leaders attending the event. All authorized persons may discipline a disruptive Scout in this manner. The authorized person must advise the Troop Committee Chairman and the Scoutmaster as soon as possible of disciplinary action(s) taken. If a Scout continues to misbehave, then the Scoutmaster shall discuss the situation with the Troop Committee. The Troop Committee will decide on additional actions. These may include, but are not limited to, temporary or permanent suspension of the Scout from the Troop.

No refund will be given for activities forfeited or for future campouts forfeited. Consensus of any disciplinary actions will be attempted by all Troop adult leadership present with the Scoutmaster or acting Scoutmaster having the final decision.

Possession of tobacco, alcohol, illegal drugs, fireworks, firearms or weapons, vandalism of property, theft, or fighting will result in automatic suspension of the Scout. The Scout and his parents must appear before the Troop Committee for reinstatement.
